The Minidoka Internment National Monument, in Idaho, is one of the newest additions to the system of parks managed by the National Park Service. The purpose of the Minidoka Internment National Monument is to provide opportunities for public education and interpretation about the internment and incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II. The Monument manages and protects resources related to Minidoka Relocation Center.

> Based on information gathered from these meetings, the National Park Service will develop alternatives for a General Management Plan that will guide the development of the National Monument over the next twenty years. Public participation is vital to the success of this planning effort; this is an event not to be missed!!!
